

## Fire Safety Checklist for Short- Term Rentals

The following checklist addresses common fire code violations and is designed to help short term rentals prepare for a future fire inspection. Although the fire code contains hundreds of code sections, compliance with these items will help make the inspection process run more smoothly.

Address Identification	
☐ Is the address clearly posted on the outside of the building in numbers at least 4 inches high?	
Emergency Information and Evacuation Diagrams	
<ul> <li>Do you have emergency and non-emergency contact information, property address, and basic emergency information regarding the property displayed and available for guests?</li> <li>Do you have evacuation diagrams showing two routes of egress posted and clearly visible in the property and on each floor?</li> </ul>	
Exits/ Door Operations	
<ul> <li>Are the doors readily openable from the inside without special knowledge or effort?</li> <li>Do your door latches open easily with no interior hasp type or hook latches that would impede exiting the building?</li> </ul>	
Fire Protection Systems	
<ul> <li>Is there a functioning smoke detector in every sleeping room and in the space immediately adjacent to every sleeping room?</li> <li>Are all smoke detectors functioning properly with batteries installed correctly?</li> </ul>	
Fire Extinguishers	
<ul> <li>□ Is there a minimum 1-A 10-BC rated fire extinguisher mounted on every floor and within every 75 feet of travel distance?</li> <li>□ Are all fire extinguishers safely mounted in their brackets in a conspicuous location and clearly visible with no obstructions from view?</li> <li>□ Are all fire extinguishers current on their inspections (annual inspections are required by a</li> </ul>	
licensed fire extinguisher servicing company)?	

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## Electric Hazards

	Is the electrical breaker box clear and accessible and not obstructed with all breakers labeled clearly?
	Are all power strips or outlet adaptors grounded and equipped with over-current protection (such as a breaker)?
	Are any extension cords or power strips extending through walls, ceilings or floors or being used in place of permanent wiring?
Storage	
	Are there any combustible materials stored near heat producing devices such as furnaces and hot water heaters?
